#### **Policy Statement:**

#### **Procedure:**

All prospective Committee Members will be provided with all relevant information to be able to contribute to the prosperity of the club.

Prior to attendance at their first Committee Members meeting, new members will:

- Receive a copy of the Association Governance Policies, Position Descriptions, Operational Limitations, Annual Report, Rules of the Association and other relevant legal governance documentation, current and recent Committee meeting papers, contact details for other Committee members, the current year's meeting schedule and the annual agenda;
- Be provided with an overview of the current sports offer through the Kensington Flemington Junior Sports Club;

- Meet with the President for a governance level familiarisation. This meeting may be held as a group session or with individuals and will include an induction into the relevant position description; and
- Meet with the Treasurer for an overview of the Club's financial operating procedures and financial position.
